

Motions for World Boxing Statute Changes

Date: 3rd November 2024, Location: Colorado, USA

As part of the ongoing growth and maturity of World Boxing, the Statutes of the organisation needs to evolve and develop as well. The Statutes require some changes since the Inaugural Congress in 2023 when they were initially approved. These changes take time and the Executive Board of World Boxing proposes that the World Boxing Congress approve the following motions.

Motion 1: One Country, One Vote Policy

Motion:

Be it hereby resolved that the voting structure of World Boxing shall be amended to implement a “One Country, One Vote” policy. All forms of tiered or weighted voting shall be removed from the Statutes. Each National Federation shall be entitled to a single, equal vote on all matters that come before the Congress for consideration.

Motion 2: Annual Congresses

Motion:

World Boxing shall amend its Statutes to require that the Congress be convened annually to ensure financial good governance of the organisation. This change shall replace the current practice, ensuring that regular annual meetings are held to review the organisation’s progress, address key issues, and promote transparent governance.

Motion 3: Reallocation of Powers from Congress to the World Boxing Executive Board

Motion:

That the detailed and precise wording in the World Boxing Statutes be amended to reallocate certain powers from the Congress to the Executive Board in order to finalise the document before 18th December 2024. This change shall grant the Executive Board the specific authority to make decisions on behalf of the organisation, solely on the drafting and wording of the Statutes in line with the principles and values held by the Congress.
