





Article 1

The respect of the election process and voting regulation will be overviewed by the WB Ethics Commission.

I – Election Process

Article 2

The voting process will take place from the date of the announcement of the candidates for each position to the election; this date will be defined by the Executive Board and shall be at least 3 months before the date of the opening of the Congress.

The candidates must declare their candidature in written to the WB President, at the latest during the day before the date of the announcement of the candidatures.

Article 3

The WB Ethics Commission must confirm, within three weeks after the date of the announcement of the candidatures, that the candidate has not breach any ethical principles and the WB Code of Ethics.

In the event of any such breach, the right to be heard of the candidate concerned must be respected, the WB Ethics Commission decision must be grounded and shared with the candidate concerned and the right of appeal shall immediately be exercised at the CAS.

Article 4

The candidates must promote their candidature with dignity and moderation; they must respect the other candidates as well as all the WB members. The promotion shall never be prejudicial to any other candidate or WB member, in particular by avoiding any type of comparison.

The candidate can produce a candidature document, which can be distributed to the WB members. The candidate shall not make any type of promises or undertaking, whatever the timing of the action promised; the candidate's document shall not include any such type of promises or undertaking.

Article 5

The candidate shall not, under any circumstances or pretext, give any present or token of friendship or offer any donation or grant any advantages of any nature or value to the WB members.

Article 6

Any third party, being WB partners or sponsors, media rights holders, government or governmental agencies (such as Embassies) of the country of the candidate, must remain neutral and neither support a candidate nor interfere in any ways in the election process.



II - Voting Regulations

Article 7

Every election within World Boxing must respect the World Boxing Statues, article 11.1 to 11.7.

The quorum required for each election by WB Congress is half the total membership of WB members with voting rights plus one.

During all voting process, the WB Code of Ethics must be respected by all the participants to the voting process.

For each specific voting process, the World Boxing Executive Board approves the Voting Regulations on the basis of the present document.

Article 8

The elections shall take place during the Congress. The date and time for the election will be decided by the President.

Article 9

The candidature for each specific position shall be declared, in a letter from the candidate to the SG, at least 3 months before the beginning of the Congress during which the election will take place.

Article 10

The election will be held by secret ballot. Electronic voting will be used; however, if technical imperatives so require, the WB President may decide to proceed using paper ballot.

In order to check the electronic voting system, a test vote will take place prior to the first vote of the Congress meeting.

Article 11

The WB President will appoint in advance three scrutineers who are not subject to any conflict of interest with the election concerned; such appointment will be announces on the web site at least a week before the opening of the congress meeting.

In needed (in case of multiple candidates for a position), the order of the candidates for the vote shall allotted by drawing of lots. Such draw will take place publicly during the Congress before the vote.

Article 12

In accordance with article 11.7 of WB Statutes, each WB Member has one vote. The vote of a member not participating in the round of voting, abstentions, and blank or spoiled votes will not be taken into account for the calculation of the required majority.

Voting by proxy is not allowed.



Article 13

The candidate who obtains the simple majority of votes cast will be proclaimed elected. Only in circumstances specified by the Statues, the majority shall be qualified of two-third of the votes cast.

Article 14

The WB President will not exercise his right to vote.

In the event the WB President is a candidate to an election, the president must set-aside before the beginning of the vote and the voting procedure will be conducted by the most senior vice-president of the Executive Board.

Article 15

In the event of more than two candidates for a position and if no majority has been obtain at a round of voting, there will be other rounds of voting until a candidate obtains the majority of the votes. The candidate obtaining the fewest votes in each of the rounds of voting will be eliminated and will not participate in the following round of voting.

If the same number of votes is obtained by two candidates during the final vote, there will be a new round of voting; if after a second round of voting for which the last two candidates obtain the same number of votes, the WB President may use his/her right to exercise a casting vote.

Article 16

The result of each round of voting will be communicated in writing by the chair of the scrutineers to the WB President, who will announce the results to the Congress as follows:

- a) At the end of each round of voting, if no candidate is elected, the WB President will not communicate the numbers of votes received by the respective candidates, but the name of the candidate who will not participate in the following round of voting. The candidate who will no longer participate will not take the floor.
- b) As soon as a candidate is elected by obtaining the majority, the WB President will announce the name of the elected candidate for the specific position; the elected person may get the floor for a short declaration.
- c) The full results of all the rounds of voting will be published as soon as the results are announced.

Article final

For any matter not specifically addressed in the present Voting Regulations and/or the WB Statutes, the Swiss Civil Code (Art. 60 et seq.) is applicable.
