PROFILE

H.R.H. Prince Nayef bin Asem bin Nayef AL HASHIM is President of the Jordan Boxing Association and a member of the Executive Board of the Jordan Olympic Committee. A former amateur boxer, he practised the sport during his university studies in London before moving into sports administration and governance.

EXPERIENCE

Since becoming President of the Jordan Boxing Association in 2024, Prince Nayef has led a programme of organisational and governance reform focused on modernisation, transparency and stronger administrative systems. His work has included revising internal structures, introducing clearer reporting lines, strengthening strategic planning and implementing digital governance processes, including electronic documentation and voting procedures for Board and committee decisions.

Under his leadership, the Association has increased its focus on athlete development, financial support for boxers and the continued development of coaches and referees. He has also worked to strengthen Jordan's boxing infrastructure and expand opportunities for young athletes. Jordan hosted the Asian U15 and U17 Championships in 2025, with the Asian Club Championship scheduled to be held in the country for the first time in December 2026.

Prince Nayef also has experience within the wider Olympic and Asian boxing structures, including as Chairperson of the Olympic Commission in Asian Boxing and as a founding member of its Interim Executive Board. Through these roles, he has developed experience in strategic planning, organisational oversight, stakeholder engagement, policy development, risk management and financial accountability.

PRIORITIES

As a candidate for Vice President of World Boxing, Prince Nayef has identified athlete development, stronger representation for Member Federations, good governance, transparency, technology and sustainable growth as key priorities. He has also highlighted the importance of education, sponsorship, branding and career pathways for athletes, while ensuring that federations with limited resources have a meaningful voice.

His stated ambition is to support the continued development of World Boxing as a modern, inclusive and athlete-centred International Federation, committed to Olympic values and the long-term growth of boxing worldwide.
