



FUNCTION: Draw Commissioner

Purpose of Position:

The Draw Commissioner is responsible for ensuring that the computerized draw is made with as much input as possible, with the objective of not having to request any changes once the draw has been made.

Accountability:

The Draw Commissioner is directly accountable to the Technical Delegate. The Draw Commissioner will undergo a performance evaluation during each competition.

Documents to submit:

R&J Bout Draw Sheet

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Ensures the Draw Commissioner Protocol as per World Boxing Competition Rules are followed.
- Reviews and uses as a reference the list (C35B) of R&Js taking part in the competition.
- Ensures the scoring operator has the latest R&J draw settings and additional filters prior to the start of the tournament.
- Ensures, during a 2-ring format tournament, the scoring operator automatically splits the R&Js into 2 rings, prior to each R&J draw. Ensures this process is done prior to each session, in order to randomly redistribute the R&Js to 2 rings and consider balance during the final stages of competition (high performance R&Js).
- Attends the daily R&J Sanctions and Filters meeting to receive feedback on the R&J evaluations from the day before.
- Communicates to the scoring operator, the R&Js that should be sanctioned (based on the feedback from the R&J Sanctions and Filters meeting) for each session.
- Ensures the scoring operator has filtered out the correct R&Js as confirmed during the R&J Sanctions and Filters meeting.
- Ensures the R&J Draw Sheet is handed to the scoring operator with or without any extraordinary change requests at least 30 minutes before the start of the session (signed by the TD and DC).
- Ensures if a change request is made prior to the start of a session, details are noted to the reason why a redraw is necessary. Ensures if a change request is made after a session has started, changes are signed by the TD and DC, detailing each individual substitution and the reason for the change.
- Ensures the R&J Coordinator receives the Bout Draw Sheet (Start list – C51) to summon the R&Js on time (sheet should be provided to the R&J Coordinator 15 minutes before the scheduled bout). The Draw Commissioner should collect this sheet from the scoring operator to distribute to the R&J Coordinator.

- Responsible for confirming the correct R&Js are in the correct position, once the R&J Coordinator summons the R&Js to the FOP.
- Assigns the R&J Evaluators their positions on a rotating schedule for each bout, ensuring neutrality with the evaluators, athletes and R&Js.
- Maintains neutrality and a work balance throughout the competition.
- Ensures that all issues, discussions and decisions are always kept confidential.
