



FUNCTION: RINGSIDE DOCTOR

Purpose of Position:

The Ringside Doctor is responsible for medically checking the Boxers, pre bout and post bout. The Ringside Doctor also ensures the boxer's safety during a bout and intervene when necessary.

Accountability:

The Ringside Doctor is directly accountable to the Medical Chair/CMO onsite. The Ringside Doctor will undergo a performance evaluation during each competition.

Documents to submit:

Medical Statistics

Post-Bout medical examination reports

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Responsible for all medical aspects in a competition based on the World Boxing Competition Rules and Regulations and the World Boxing Medical Rules.
- Evaluates the medical records of the athletes during the Boxing Entries Check.
- Conducts Medical Examinations during the daily weigh in.
- Conducts Medical Examinations for all R&Js prior to the competition.
- Responsible for checking the medical facilities at ringside when officiating.
- Identifies the location of the stretcher and the paramedic team, other recovery equipment, evacuation equipment and the route of evacuation.
- Participates in medical training and simulations with the LOC medical staff.
- Assists the Officials in case a medical situation arises during a bout.
- Examines the Boxer during a bout, upon the Referee's requests.
- Treat an injury of a boxer during a pause in a bout initiated by the Referee, for a maximum of one (1) minute, following the correct procedure.
- During a pause in a bout initiated by the Referee, advises the Referee if the Boxer is fit or unfit to continue.
- If a competing boxer appears unable to continue, in the ringside doctor's opinion, a request to stop the bout must be made to the DTD or TD.
- Conducts a post-bout medical exam after each bout.
- Submits completed post-bout medical forms and medical statistics to the Medical Chairperson after each session.
